BNEI AKIVA is a Jewish religious Zionist youth movement, the largest Zionist youth movement in the world. We inspire and empower young Jews all over the world with a sense of commitment to the Jewish people, the Land of Israel and the Torah, placing an emphasis on the value of Aliyah to the State of Israel.

WORLD BNEI AKIVA, a non-profit organization with headquarters in Jerusalem, works with Jewish communities in the Diaspora, assisting and strengthening the local Bnei Akiva snifim (branches), as well as the wider Jewish community. Kivun has been uniquely created to meet your needs as young Jews. Most of the program is with like-minded youth from North America, England, mainland Europe and beyond. Additionally, significant parts of the year have been designed to cross paths with other World Bnei Akiva Hachshara programs from around the world.

This means you will have the opportunity to learn, hike and celebrate Chagim with other young Jews from over 15 different countries; Americans, Canadians and Europeans together with you on Kivun, and others from Australia to Italy, and from Uruguay to South Africa. The coming together of future Jewish leaders from so many different countries and backgrounds will enrich your year and give you friends from around the world.

Leadership-focused learning

Kivun aims to give you a broad knowledge base while focusing on relevant and engaging topics, and we're not afraid to ask difficult questions about faith, religion and identity.

Kibbutz

From the early days of the State, kibbutzim had a sense of duty, serving as a pillar of strength for Zionism. The members lived under extreme conditions, while tilling the soil, draining the swamplands, and building a settlement. Today, World Bnei Akiva's Hachshara participants are viewed as valuable contributors to the kibbutz movement.

Working with kibbutz members, you'll share duties in the field, gardens, factories, kitchen, animals, dining hall or childcare facilities. You'll be offered placements according to the work requirements of the kibbutz, and you'll live together in kibbutz housing. Lunch is together in the communal dining room, and dinners and breakfasts are prepared by the participants - encouraging responsibility and independence. You'll greatly improve your Hebrew through such interactions and with Ulpan classes. Down time is enjoyed relaxing at the local spring, and you'll discover the area with weekly tiyulim.

The group will also become involved in kibbutz social and communal activities such as Shabbat and holiday celebrations, enabling you to have a closer view of what kibbutz life means for the children and adults who reside there permanently.

Community Volunteering

You'll volunteer in a neighborhood in one of Israel's socioeconomically deprived areas where there is a real need
for volunteers. This will bring you to experience a part of
Israel that you would not necessarily encounter elsewhere.
Volunteer placements may include teaching English in local
community centers, helping in soup kitchens, working with
the elderly, and sports. Your time will be supplemented with
a learning program and evening activities. Through your
experience, you will gain appreciation for the challenges
facing the people of Israel today.

Jewish Enrichment

In addition to the ongoing learning curriculum and learning seminars, there is great value for a participant on a Bnei Akiva gap-year to have the opportunity to strengthen learning skills, familiarity with Torah texts and immersion in a fulltime Torah-learning environment. Therefore we offer an option for an intensive Jewish Enrichment learning track. The group will be guided by outstanding educators and have a timetable catered specifically for them. They will have the opportunity to delve into topics ranging from Talmud and Tanach, Halacha and Machshava, Jewish History and more all part of the unique structure of Kivun.

Please note: There is a required minimum of participants to run this track.



Magen David Adom

Magen David Adom provides effective emergency first-aid treatment. You'll be part of this mission and gain valuable hands-on experience giving basic medical treatment while experiencing "real life" in Israel.

After completing a training course, you'll volunteer alongside Israelis on ambulances at various MDA stations across the country. You'll be a certified "First Responder", recognized throughout MDA Israel. Kivun will be assigned a station based on the needs of MDA. Depending on the number of volunteers, the group may be split into various stations. Participants must be in good physical and mental health, and basic conversational Hebrew is required.

The work you will do saves lives and has a lasting effect on Israeli society. It is highly rewarding and is ideal for people who enjoy working with and helping others.

Important: **Before** coming on World Bnei Akiva Hachshara, participants wishing to volunteer for MDA must have had Hepatitis B, MMR, and COVID-19 vaccinations, and must bring the accompanying documentation. In addition, the MDA application includes a Hebrew test. Conversational Hebrew may be ok, but we recommend starting to learn Hebrew even before Hachshara starts. The number of MDA participants may be limited depending on the need for volunteers, and final acceptance is up to MDA.

familiar with Israel by experiencing the physical and emotional challenges of the country and its people. Through hiking the land, living in field conditions navigating deserts and participating in seminars and lectures, you'll learn about the issues of the country.

The program is based in the Southern Negev, but you'll spend your time in various other parts of the country, including Jerusalem, the Golan Heights and the Galilee. The two-month experience is conducted in easy Hebrew, and as participants come from all over the world, that becomes the common language of communication allowing for significant improvement of Hebrew skills.

Important: Marva is a physically demanding program, and participants are expected to be in a good physical condition and highly motivated. You will be required to have a personal interview prior to acceptance. Marva may ask for a financial deposit in exchange for the uniforms and equipment, which will be returned at the end of the program.

Shoah Seminar and Journey to Poland

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Partnership with Kol Ami

Kol Ami, a subsidiary of the Jewish Agency, is a non-profit organization that offers gap year programs modeled on the Israeli "mechina" experience. It was founded out of a deep understanding that the most effective way to build a sustainable connection between Jewish youth and the State of Israel is by creating personal relationships with the people of Israel.

Kol Ami offers a range of gap year experiences that pairs post-high school Israeli teens with Jewish teens from around the world. World Bnei Akiva's Mechina Olamit partnered with Kol Ami in 2017, and is the only religious Mechina of the 7 programs they offer. Mechina Olamit, with Kol Ami, is approved by the Ministry of Education and the IDF, and is part of the Mechinot Ofek network of mechinot.

Mechina Olamit

The "Mechina" formula is a real Israeli success story. Each year tens of thousands of young Israelis join one of the hundreds of Mechinot to prepare for the challenges of transitioning from school into the IDF. Many of them go on to leadership roles both within and after the army.

The Mechina Olamit applies this same successful formula to a gap year program for young Jews from around the world as they transition to university, community leadership roles, and their professional lives in the future. Our Israelis and international particpants join together for the entire program!

Program Components

Leadership

With our professional guidance, and carefully crafted activities and workshops, participants develop their own unique leadership skills, and the confidence to serve as a personal example. Through their own initiative and teamwork they establish and run committees that steer the very course of the program, and work on individual and group projects to hone their skills. Committees are responsible for many aspects of Mechina life including educational content, PR, cooking, army preparation, tiyulim and more.

Torah Learning & Lifestyle

Our learning program teaches a religious Zionist and Modern Orthodox educational philosophy. We believe in learning for the sake of growing which makes classes lively, positive, relevant and involved. Topics studied include Torah and Jewish texts, tfilla, emuna, Jewish history, Zionism, and philosophy. You'll be guided throughout, and different levels will be catered for. To be a participant on the Mechina, you don't need prior knowledge in Jewish studies - you

Community Service

As part of the immersion into Israeli society and to contribute to it, participants dedicate time to volunteer within a local community. Projects include teaching English in schools, visiting the elderly, working with people with disabilities, and agricultural work.

Love of Israel

Participants discover Israel both geographically and socially, as we encourage them to challenge their pre-existing perceptions of the country and the people. They are exposed to all sectors of the Israeli population, and develop their own understanding of how the pioneering spirit is still very much alive in contemporary Israel. With the Love and connection to the Land of Israel being such a core element of the program, our participants grow to become the newest link in the chain of pioneers.

Hebrew Learning

Throughout the program, our international participants take part in our own dedicated "Ulpan" - intensive Hebrew learning course, with 2 classes a week divided according to 3 different levels: beginner, intermediate and advanced. However the best Hebrew learning is through their daily interactions with their Israeli peers at the Mechina with whom they share everything.

Jewish Peoplehood

The Mechina Olamit strives to bolster the link between Israel's Jews and Diaspora Jewry through their common historical, religious, and cultural heritage. We actively work to instill within our participants a desire for mutual action and commitment to a stronger and positive Jewish

Fitness & Army Preparation

As all the Israeli participants, and some of the international participants will soon be joining the IDF, we make every effort to help ensure they have a meaningful service. Therefore, there are classes and activities carefully designed to deal with a wide range of subjects relating to army service including ethics, leadership and structure of the IDF. Twice a week there are physical training classes for all participants. Classes are run by professionals as well as by participants. All participants gain self-empowerment through coping with physically challenging situations, and develop physical fitness, inner strength and resilience. MECHINA

Seminars & Trips

There are regular three to six-day seminars and trips around the country to expose the participants to a wide array of topics and build an intimate familiarity with the land of Israel. Seminars include: Israeli society, Shoah, Zionism, Jewish Peoplehood, Gush Etzion, Navigation, Army preparation, Desert Survival and Chovek Israel – the final two-week trip from North to South of Israel planned entirely by participants. Participants help plan and run many aspects of each trip and seminar, including building educational elements, accommodation, cooking, navigating, and guest speakers.








Asked Questions

Why Hachshara?

If you are looking for more than just a GAP between high school and University, and want to **G**row Jewishly, **A**cquire important and relevant tools & skills for life, and to develop **P**ersonally, then our Hachshara programs are the ideal choice for you! As one of the largest and most popular providers of Israel Gap Year programs, and the primary organization catering to Religious Zionist youth, you can trust World Bnei Akiva's Hachshara programs to deliver what you are looking for and more!

Will I see my friends on other programs?

Yes, there are various times when the different World Bnei Akiva-Hachshara groups are together. You'll also have ample free time and Shabbatot to make your own plans and arrange visits to those on other programs or at other Yeshivot and Midrashot.

What security measures are taken?

Your safety is our primary concern. As an approved MASA gap year program, we follow the security advice of the relevant security agencies in Israel and run our activities with their approval. In the event of a change in the security situation, we will inform you. Occasionally, as a precaution, you may be asked to not go out, even during free time.

Will Hachshara be useful for my university application?

The value of gap year activities is widely acknowledged and most universities will allow you to apply for deferred entry. It is a good idea to include details of your proposed gap year in your personal statement to support your application. Additionally, courses provided on Hachshara may count for credits at certain colleges and universities.

Are arrangements made for special dietary requirements?

If you require a special diet or have a severe allergy that may necessitate extra attention, please state this in a letter attached to your medical form. Although it may not always be possible, we will make every effort to cater for your needs.

Are medical care and insurance provided?

Medical services and insurance for illness and injury while in Israel on Hachshara is included in the cost of the program. Doctors affiliated with the plan are located throughout Israel and you can easily arrange to see one, no matter where you are based at the time. Treatment related to pre-existing conditions is not included in the coverage. You are advised to take out 'personal effects insurance' to cover your valuable belongings and we will be happy to send you the details from our recommended insurers.

O I need to arrange a visa for a year in Israel?

Yes, you will need a student visa prior to arrival in Israel. Once you have been accepted to the program, our registration coordinator will guide you through the process. If you or your parents have Israeli citizenship, then the visa requirements are different. This must be discussed with your Israeli mission, who will advise you what steps are necessary to complete before arrival in Israel including army exemption. Please note that visa requirements are set by the Israeli Government and are subject to change.

KIVUN - FAQ

Who is this program for?

If you are seeking an experiential program within a religious Zionist framework and are highly motivated to maximize your year in Israel, then Kivun is the ideal choice for you! With Kivun, you will have the opportunity to live independently in Israel, immerse yourself in Israeli society firsthand, and undergo Jewish and personal growth. You'll enjoy incredible experiences, and have fun with new friends from around the globe.

How do group Shabbatot work?

Kivun roughly follows an alternating in-out-out schedule which is adapted depending on the specific time of year. The group Shabbatot are both at home or visiting other communities in Israel. Staff members will ensure participants have somewhere to go on free Shabbatot.

Will there be vacation time?

Kivun is a nine-month program and every day is important! In order to maximize participants' time in Israel, there is only vacation during Chol Hamoed Sukkot & Pesach after the Seder.

Should I bring bedding or a sleeping bag?

You should bring both. We provide a pillow and blanket, but you will need to have bedding. There are companies that hire out sets to gap year participants, to save you from schlepping it to Israel in your luggage.

What else should I bring?

A few weeks before the start of Kivun, we'll send you a packing list, containing all the essentials for an amazing year in Israel!



MECHINA - FAQ

Who manages the Mechina?

The Mechina is run both by a Rosh (head) and Menahel (director) - together managing all aspects of the mechina - education' logistics, budget, safety etc. Participants are divided into two groups, each one with 2-3 Madrichim (counselors) and headed by a Rakaz or Rakezet (head of group). Standing behind the Mechina are both World Bnei Akiva and the Jewish Agency.

Where is the Mechina Olamit based?

The Mechina Olamit is based in Kibbutz Migdal Oz, which is a religious Kibbutz located in Gush Etzion, close to Efrat.

Where do participants come from?

There are two main groups on the program: Israelis who will be enrolling in the army the following March, and participants from abroad who are either taking a gap year, becoming "lone soldiers" or are olim chadashim

What language is the program run in?

The program is split into three 3-month semesters. The first three months of the program is run in English, after that the program runs in Hebrew.

Where do the participants live and eat?

Participants from mixed backgrounds live in rooms of four. The rooms are basic and include air-conditioning and en-suite bathroom. Breakfast and dinner are prepared by the participants and lunch is in the kibbutz dining hall. Kashrut is strictly observed.

What is the religious observance at the Mechina Olamit?

The Mechina operates in religious Zionist framework. Participants at the Mechina Olamit are expected to observe halacha including Shabbat observance in public and private spaces, three tfillot a day for both male and female participants, and tzniut regarding dress code and modest behavior.

How do Shabbatot work?

The Mechina will roughly follow an alternating "in"- "out" schedule, and will be adapted depending on the specific time of year. The group Shabbatot will be both either at the Mechina, or visiting another community in Israel. Staff members will ensure participants have somewhere to go on free Shabbatot.

Will there be free time / a vacation break?

The Mechina is a nine-month program and every day is important! In order to maximize participants' time in Israel, there will only be vacation during parts of Sukkot, Channuka and Pesach.

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APPLY NOW - HOW TO DO IT

- 1. For both programs, apply online at www.worldbneiakiva.org/application | Once you have begun the application process, you can sign back in as many times as you like to continue the application. There is one application for all programs, with an option to select your program/s of interest.
- 2. Carefully read the Application Guidelines on the website before starting the application. This includes, among other requirements, completing the medical form which needs to be signed and stamped by a doctor, and uploaded to the application website.
- 3. Register with MASA at www.masaisrael.org | Masa is a project of the Israeli government that offers Hachshara participants an automatic grant, with further needs-based funding available.

Tuition

Tuition for Kivun and Mechina covers all costs during programming, including seminars, tiyulim, accommodation & food during programming, program visas. Exact tuition for each program can be found on

The tuition fee does not cover costs for optical care, treatment of prior dental problems, medical care relating to pre-existing conditions, hepatitis-B, COVID-19, and MMR vaccinations or additional checkups (that may be required by MARVA/ MDA volunteers), laundry, and food during free Shabbatot/ chofesh times. In addition, you may be required to purchase your own books and learning materials for the study

Please contact us for more details.

How will I know if I have been accepted?

After we receive your application, you'll be invited for an interview for the program/s you selected. Your interview allows us to get to know you a bit better and assess your suitability for the program/s of your choice. It will also give you the opportunity to ask any specific questions you may have.

Shortly after the interview, you'll be informed of your acceptance. Your place will be confirmed only after a payment plan has been agreed.
